The original LOGO consisted of a HONDA GL1500, the GA State Outline, the State Fruit along with the notable “FLYING TEETH” gnat drawn by local artist Gerald. M. Avery.

Chapter K is located in Kingsland, Georgia. Kingsland is in the southeast corner of Georgia and is approximately 40 miles north of Jacksonville, Florida and 30 miles south of Brunswick, Georgia
